OUR VISION FOR PORT HOUSTON

We envision Port Houston becoming a beacon of light through the restoring hope and love that God offers all. Neighbors in Action builds on assets already in the neighborhood, working to end poverty, injustice, and oppression by empowering the people in the community through spiritual and educational programs.

WHERE WE WORK

The Port Houston neighborhood is seven miles east of downtown Houston and less than one mile from the Ship Channel Turning Basin, inside Loop 610. The population of approx. 5000 is 96% Hispanic with many living below the poverty line. There are no health facilities, grocery stores, pharmacies, or other typical retail outlets, and options for public transportation are limited. The neighborhood is surrounded on all four sides by railways or industrial development. The U.S. Department of Justice closed a bar in the neighborhood known as a hub for trafficking underage girls. Many teenagers drop out of high school and teenage pregnancy is common.





FIRST FLOOR

- Large multi-purpose community space for groups up to 100
- Meeting room for small groups.
- Two bathrooms, one with shower to accommodate overnight groups
- Large capacity demonstration kitchen for cooking and healthy nutrition classes
- Covered outdoor pavilion and patio for sports, exercise classes and a weekend thrift shop
- Secure storage area for sports equipment and thrift shop goods
- Secure play area for pre-schoolers

SECOND FLOOR

- Administrative office overlooking 1st floor community space and main entrance
- Library for tutoring and study
- Additional meeting room for small groups.
- North facing windows provide natural light to all 2nd floor rooms and 1st floor multi-purpose room



The building is designed for low maintenance and energy efficiency as well as safety policies. Program space is secured with minimal doorways and a controlled entrance. The exterior design features make the space open and inviting with lots of color and a low fence. Our main entry sidewalk will meet the sidewalk from Siro Gutierrez Park, a city park directly across the street. The Park will feel like an extension of our space, and vice versa.

Maribel, NIA Board Member:

"Due to my husband's work as a police officer in Honduras, he had many threats from different gangs in Honduras. We had to leave our country on Christmas with our two sons, and applied for political asylum when we arrived at the US-Mexican border. we were able to start our new life here in Port
Houston. I love NIA, especially our Moms' Group. I have heard other
