

Historic Houston Churches Join Forces For MLK Event

Two of Houston's oldest churches – First Methodist Houston, established in Houston in 1838, and Trinity United Methodist, Houston's first African-American church, established in 1865 – are collaborating together on a joint celebration of Martin Luther King, Jr. and the heroes of the civil rights movement, to be held at First Methodist Houston's historic downtown sanctuary on Main Street on Sunday, January 19th at 4 p.m.

The event, "Legacy: A Celebration of the Life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.," will feature the churches' combined youth, musicians, and choirs, and feature a collection of music historically connected to the civil rights movement and the life of Martin Luther King, Jr. Reverend Edward Jones, Senior Pastor at Trinity United Methodist Church, will deliver the address.

A special offering will be held to support college campus ministries at University of Houston and Texas Southern University. A catered reception at First Methodist Houston will commence immediately following the event.
