The word maundy comes from the Latin words mandatum novum, which mean new commandment. On Maundy Thursday we commemorate two events. The first is the Passover meal that Jesus shared with his disciples the night before his crucifixion. The second is Jesus' long night of prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane after which he was arrested and then abandoned and denied by his disciples.

Maundy Thursday marks the beginning of the Easter Triduum during which Jesus died, was buried, and rose again. The services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter function as one service in three parts. We encourage you to worship on each of these days to fully experience the miracle of redemption made possible through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
